<sup>1</sup> On 12 July 1740, the widow Eva remarried to Georg Lautenschläger of Laudenu. The family then moved from Klein-Gumpen to Laudenu (except for the two oldest children who married and remained in Klein-Gumpen). Consequently, the confirmation records of child #6 and child #8 give Lautenu as the home village.

<sup>2</sup> Juliana (child #1) and her brother Heinrich Germann (child #2) married Adam Rausch and his sister Catharina. Adam and Catharina were children of Johann Georg Rausch and Eva Nagel. The relationship of Eva Nagel (wife of Georg Rauch) to Christoph Nagel (husband of child #3) is not known.

<sup>3</sup> Christoph and Margretha had two children before sailing to America on the Albany in 1749: 1) Johann Adam born 3 July 1746 and died 27 Aug 1747 and 2) Elisabetha Margretha born 12 July 1748. A burial record at Christ Lutheran Church in Berks Co, PA is probably hers. (Margretha Nagel died 22 Mar 1825 at age 77.)

#### Adam's Will of 1776

His Will, made in 1776 was not filed for probate until 10 June 1782 (Lancaster Co, PA, Book Y, Volume 2, page 238). The two men who filed Adam's Will for probate in 1782 (Peter Berry and Jacob Belleman) stated under oath that Adam had dictated his will to them on his deathbed in June 1776 and then died on June 16 or 17, 1776.

According to the deposition: "On the 14 June 1776 Adam lay very ill at the house of Valentine Vry in Heidelberg Township being much bruised by a waggon and horses which accidentally run over him, and the said Adam then being of good and sound understanding did direct the foregoing writing to be drawn as and for the last will and testament that the same was done immediately in his presence and offered to him to sign. That he declared that the same was his will but could not write his name thereto on account of the bruises and fractures he had on him and that the said Adam after such direction and declaration lived two or three days and then died."

<sup>6</sup> Adam Germann at age 18 had sailed to America in 1749 on the ship *Albany*, but Adam returned to Germany two or three years later, married Margaret and then returned to Pennsylvania. The Neunkirchen Church book contains this 1752 marriage record: "On 14 May 1752 Johann Adam, a surviving son of Conrad German of Gumpen (Conrad died in 1736), married Margretha Elisabetha Lannert, daughter of Johann Nickel Lannert of Winterkastern." Adam's name is not on a ship's Oath of Allegiance list when he returned to America in 1752 or shortly thereafter, because he would not have been required to retake the oath he had taken in 1749.

1) **Johann Adam Germann (born 1731)** from Klein-Gumpen arrived at Philadelphia on the ship *Albany* in 1749 and settled in Heidelberg Township, Lancaster County. In 1813, this part of Lancaster County was included in the newly-formed Lebanon County. Adam died in June 1776, only days before the signing of the Declaration of Independence.
