Martha Maddox who being sworn deposes & says
That ~~George Maddox~~ she is the wife of
George Maddox deceased who was a private of
Capt Buntady Company 2d Regiment of
Barton Artillery Commanded by Colver
in the service of the Confederate States in the
present war with the U. S. That the said George
Maddox entered the service in Griffin Spalding
County Ga but a citizen of Muscogee Co Ga
on about day of 1861 and died at
Savannah with brain fever on the 2nd day
of March 1862 leaving a wife and one child.

That she makes this deposition for the purpose
of obtaining from the Government of the Confederate
States whatever may have been due the said
George A Maddox at the time of his death
for pay, bounty or other allowances for his
services as a private Soldier as afore
said. Sworn to and subscribed before
me

well known to me, and whom I hereby certify

George A Maddox for 8 years the deceased
Soldier herein mentioned and that the
Statement made under oath by Martha
Maddox the claimant as to her relation-
ship to the said deceased Soldier is true and
correct in every particular to the best of his
belief and that the said Levi Bishop
