mind & memory at this time think fit to make and ordain
this to be my last will and testament, revoking all others
whatsoever heretofore made by me. In the first place I recom-
mend my soul to God who gave it, and my body to be
buried in a Christian like manner & I give to my wife
Elizabeth one negro woman by the name of Stilda absolutely
ty five acres of land including the house whereon I now live
during her natural life or widowhood and at her death or
intermarriage I give the above named property & all its in-
crease to my daughter Stilda I also give to my daughter
Sarah one negro girl by the name of Jude. I also give to my
daughter Mary one negro girl by the name of Linda I also give
to my daughter Nancy one negro girl by the name of Stee
also I give to my daughter Elizabeth Digby one negro boy
by the name of Rache. The balance of my property that is not
already devised my will and desire is for it to be equally di-
vided between all my children namely Richard Hillyard
William Hillyard. Leonard Hillyard. Nancy Hillyard John
Hillyard Stilda Hillyard. Signed sealed and delivered this

14th day of July 1813

I Richard H. Gilbert
 of Wilkes County, Georgia do hereby make and declare the
 following as my last will and testament, First to the persons
 herein after named I bequeath in trust, for the use of my daughter
 Sarah Willhouse Gilbert the sum of twenty thousand dollars in
 cash or in goods debts well secured, to be set a part in twelve
 months after my death. This fund I desire may be placed in the
 hands of the trustees in trust as aforesaid, for my said daughter
 Sarah to be by them managed, and conducted in such manner they
 may think best, to unite the advantages of profit and security.
 I do then the said trustees to dispose of the annual income thereof
 in the manner following that is to say, until my said daughter
 arrives at twenty one years of age or marries if within that age
 her guardian shall defray out of the proceeds or annual income
 derived from this legacy such expenses as they may deem proper
 to incur for her education and supports, and to pay of any arrears
 of expense that may have accrued on her account, the surplus
 of said annual income which shall remain after paying her
