# SOLDIER'S APPLICATION FOR PENSION.

makes the following declaration in order to obtain the pension under the provisions of an act entitled "An Act to amend chapter 191 of the Laws of 1889, for the relief of certain Confederate Soldiers and Widows," ratified March 2, 1901: That he is the identical *By* *Wm. Nogle*

Reg. N. C. State Troops, on or about the *15* day of

*April*, 1862, to serve in the armies of the late Confederate States, and that while in said

service at *Shoofshung*, in the State of

*MD*, on or about the *10* day of *September*, 1862,

he received a wound or wounds, etc.

He further states that he is, and has been for twelve months immediately preceding this Application for Pension, a bona fide resident of North Carolina; that he holds no office under the United States, or under any State or County, from which he is receiving the sum of three hundred dollars as fees or as salary annually; that he is not worth in his own right, or the right of his wife, property at its assessed value for taxation to the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500), nor has he disposed of property

of such value by gift or voluntary conveyance since the 1st of March, 1863, and that he is not receiving any aid from the State of North Carolina under any other statute providing for the relief of the disabled and injured soldiers of the State.

N. C. State Troops, on or about the 5th day of May, 1862, to serve in the armies of the late Confederate States.

She further states that she was married to said Soldier or Sailor before the first day of April, 1865, and that she is now a widow, and has been for twelve months immediately preceding this Application for Pension, a *bona fide* resident of North Carolina; that she holds no office under the United States or under any State or County from which she is receiving the sum of three hundred dollars or fees or as salary annually; that she is not worth in her own right, or the right of her late husband, property at its assessed value for taxation to the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500), nor has she disposed of property of such value by gift or voluntary conveyance since the 11th of March, 1865.

That her said husband Sylvanus Hoyle was a pensioner of the U. S. Army as the Lincoln Post Pensioner rolls until his death on the blank day of July, 1914.
